## HEALTH CONNECTIONS

*Excerpts from articles published by Harvard Medical School, John Hopkins Medicine, and The Recovery Village*



- Have you ever had a "gut-wrenching" experience?
- Do certain situations make you "feel nauseous"?
- Have you ever felt "butterflies" in your stomach?

We use these expressions for a reason. The gastrointestinal tract is sensitive to emotion. Anger, anxiety, sadness, elation — all of these feelings and others can trigger symptoms in the gut. Similarly, the food we eat is a major factor in our mindset and mood. The stomach is commonly referred to as our second brain. Evidence shows that bacteria in the gut from the food we consume affect mood, cognition, and behavior. This connection begs the question: Which foods can we consume to boost our mental health?

Walnuts, chia seeds, avocado, sweet potatoes, blueberries, salmon, and leafy greens like spinach have numerous benefits that support both physical and mental health while fighting inflammation. Studies demonstrate a strong correlation between inflammation and increased risk of mood disorders like depression. Understandably, people turn to comfort foods when they're upset or overwhelmed. While sweets can be the ultimate consolation prize after a tough day, these treats are inflammatory and can end up making us feel worse as a spike in blood sugar negatively impacts mood and emotions. So next time life stressors bring you down, try swapping out ice cream for Greek yogurt topped with chia seeds, walnuts, and blueberries. This refreshing snack can keep your blood sugar stable and improve how you feel, both physically and emotionally.

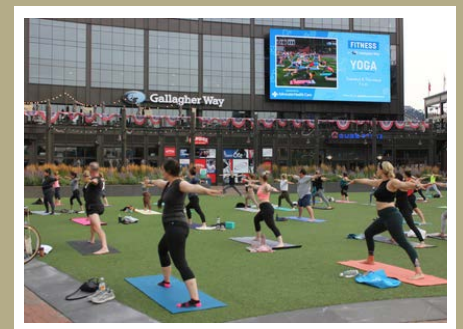

## FLOATING HOLIDAY

In recognition of Juneteenth and to acknowledge various days that may be of individual importance to our employees, Fr. Jack and Misericordia would like to offer a gift of a Floating Holiday of up to 8 hours to be used following the guidelines below. Please use this for a day important to you or your culture or religion –or maybe even your birthday!

**This is effective July 5, 2023 - June 30, 2024.**

A floating holiday is classified separately from your PTO and may only be scheduled in advance through your Supervisor while adhering to the following parameters:

- The “Floating Holiday” is an 8-hour paid day off - hours can be used between 7/5/2023 and 6/30/2024. (if you work 10-12 hours, it will cover 8 hours)
- This is a benefit for PT and FT employees only
- Must schedule in advance according to schedule request policy
- Cannot be used on a currently published schedule
- Cannot be used to cover a call in
- Must be used within the fiscal year (use by 6/30/2024) - it will not roll over
- Cannot be split into half days or partial hours must be used in the entirety

# HR AND STAFF DEVELOPMENT

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## MCAULEY PILOT PROGRAM

Staffing challenges continue to be our greatest issue at Misericordia, one that impacts all of our employees and residents every day. In an effort to increase our ability to compete with other employers we are launching a Pilot Program at McAuley in the Yellow Neighborhood. The McAuley Pilot Program allows for a wide variety of scheduling opportunities for new hires and current employees who work in the Yellow Neighborhood. This includes less weekend days and alternative shifts (10, 12 and 16 hours). With a variety of scheduling options and less weekend days, recruitment efforts will focus on these highlights to attract a higher volume of candidates resulting in better staffing overall. If successful in the Yellow Neighborhood, the Pilot Program will then be rolled out to additional Neighborhoods in McAuley and possibly beyond. Stay tuned for updates in the coming weeks.

Per the 401k Plan's provisions, on **July 1st** of each year Misericordia will increase the Automatic Salary Reduction Contribution by 1% for those who have **not opted out** of this plan provision. This automatic salary reduction will take place until the plan year in which your contribution equals 10%, unless you wish to increase the amount beyond 10%. For those who have previously opted out of the automatic increase and would like to turn it back "ON", follow the steps below. **Please note: All changes to your salary reduction contribution need to take place through the Correll Co's online portal at [www.correllco.com](http://www.correllco.com) by June 30th.**

# HR AND STAFF DEVELOPMENT

## THE PHI COACHING APPROACH—RECEIVING FEEDBACK

### SOME THINGS TO REFLECT ON:

- How can I manage my own self-criticism?
- What do I need to do to be as receptive as possible to feedback?
- What is my general style of taking on critical feedback? Positive feedback? What aspects of this do I want to hang onto/let go of?

### A FEW NON-PRODUCTIVE WAYS OF RECEIVING FEEDBACK:



- Agreeing indiscriminately, swallowing whole
- Disagreeing, rationalizing, justifying, disowning
- Beating yourself up, feeling worthless, inept

### CAN YOU REMEMBER A TIME WHEN CRITICAL FEEDBACK HELPED YOU MAKE AN IMPORTANT CHANGE THAT HAS BENEFITTED YOU?

- How can I use my memory and understanding of that time to help me respond to and take in critical feedback?



With the Annual Review season upon us, it's a good time to remind ourselves of some suggestions from our PHI training regarding how we receive feedback.

It's normal to feel some anxiety or stress regarding the review process. Often, when facing feedback, we slip into a frantic state of mind – think “fight or flight” response! This makes listening and dialogue challenging. Our listening can become blocked with either preparing our defenses or judging the person giving the feedback or only listening to the parts of the feedback we want to hear. Often, we either dismiss the information as off-base or accept it fully without thinking about it. But we have a choice in how we respond to the feedback. Rather than rejecting the feedback outright or accepting all of it, seek a middle path where you can listen and dialogue with the person giving your review.

So what might help you prepare for your Annual Review? Think of those strategies that help you “pull back” and remain calm...deep breaths, doing a quick body scan, taking a walk before or after, asking for more time to consider your response - what works best for you? In the actual meeting, be sure to ask for clarification, paraphrase what you are hearing, and share your perspective!

Receiving feedback is essential if we want to learn and grow – professionally and personally. We hope this process will be a two-way conversation between you and your supervisor that will further your development at Misericordia.

# CAMPUS SAFETY

## ID USAGE AND SAFETY AWARENESS KEEPS ALL OF US SAFE



All employees are required to have their Misericordia ID with them when working and when on campus. We all bear the responsibility to ensure that safety is kept as a top priority for the Residents and for our Employees. When a Receptionist requests ID upon entry, employees are to comply with this request. Entry to a building or home may be refused without proper identification.



When entering through doors in the Main Building, Conway or other areas, all are asked to be aware of non-employees who may try to gain entry. All visitors should enter through Thome or Ridge Reception. All job seekers should enter through the front door of HR. If approached, do not bring a non-employee through the building. Direct them to the correct point of entry.

We appreciate your attention to these simple safety measures that can help to keep us all safe.

## EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS REFRESHER SHELTER IN PLACE

### WHAT IS SHELTER IN PLACE?

- This alert is given anytime it becomes necessary for the safety of all to stay where they are until we know that conditions are safe
- May occur due to tornado warning/watch, severe thunderstorms, ice/snow storm, emergency situations on campus, and any other situation as directed by admin/security

### WHAT IS OUR DISASTER RELOCATION POLICY?

- Each area fire plan contains an evacuation route to the location of the area's external holding area or "safe house"
- If campus needs to be evacuated in its entirety, we will go to S&C Electric at Devon and Ridge

### WHAT DO YOU DO DURING SHELTER IN PLACE?

- Everyone should remain inside, no should leave
- Staff and residents walking on campus at the time of the directive should shelter in the nearest building. Notify the supervisor so everyone is accounted for
- Only staff with Mis IDs or first responders should be permitted into the building
- Walkie-talkies should be turned to channel 2
- If instructed to do so, lock all windows and close all doors
- Wait for further direction to be given

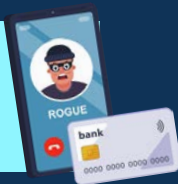

## DON'T BE A VICTIM OF IDENTITY THEFT



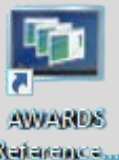
### WHEN ACCESSING MOBILE APPS AND PAY/BANKING WEBSITES, REMEMBER THE FOLLOWING DO'S AND DON'TS

- **Don't** save your password on your mobile apps or shared computer for banking and pay websites.
- **Do** enter your password directly each time you access the mobile applications. You can also use the facial recognition or thumb print feature to access the mobile app.
- **Do** sign into any app and websites using the authentication features for secure applications like banking and payroll related apps, like Paychex, Paylocity or ADP.
- **Do** choose passwords that are strong and hard to be hacked (using a mixture of alphabetical and numeric, upper and lowercase and special characters when creating your passwords).
- **Don't** write down passwords where other people can find them.

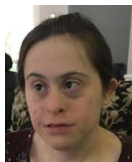
